Christian Aid Week - We put out a record 1,480 envelopes to be distributed House to House. Of these a record 1,390 were distributed around the houses of Bowness, which was 30% more than last year. Door to Door reaped £1,314, the same as last year. We raised £667 in the Christian Aid Coffee Morning. The 3X bucket collection in Bowness raised £106 but the cost of a statutory ad in the Gazette halved this. Gift Aid declarations raised a further £180 down from a 2021 peak of £242. It is important to obtain this as this is free for us. This gave a grand total of £2,240, our best Christian Aid week yet. Thanks to all the deliverers, collectors, cake bakers, and coffee helpers. Thank you from all the people round the world you have helped.
